



## NTI President for a Day Contest

### Rules and Regulations

Are you a high school student who is enrolled or eligible to enroll under the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement? Would you like to be the president of Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. for a day?

If you answer yes to these two questions, you could win a trip for two to Iqaluit!

To celebrate the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement on July 9, 2013, Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. is hosting a contest for Inuit youth who are attending high school. To enter the contest, students must write a 500-word speech about the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement. The winner of the NTI President for a Day Contest will deliver this speech at the unveiling of the 20th anniversary monument in Iqaluit on Nunavut Day, July 9, 2013. The winner will also co-host the Nunavut Day activities and performs other duties as president of NTI.

A panel of NTI judges will review the submissions and select a winner. If the winner already resides in Iqaluit, a prize of \$1,500 will be awarded.

Submissions are due April 26, 2013.

### 1. Administration of Contest

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All contestants are responsible for ensuring they have all the information they need to participate in the NTI President for a Day Contest and to abide by these Rules and Regulations.

### 2. Term of the NTI President for a Day Contest

The NTI President for a Day Contest closes at 5 p.m. ET April 26, 2013.

### 3. Eligible Participants

The NTI President for a Day Contest is open to high school students who are enrolled or eligible to enroll under the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement. Contestants must be attending high school or are attending high school at the time of the contest and have since successfully graduated.

NTI employees, elected or appointed NTI officials and members of their immediate families are not eligible to participate.

All participants under the age of 18 are required to submit an NTI release and consent form signed by a parent or legal guardian.

Participants may be required to provide a letter from their schools stating that they are attending high school and have met attendance requirements.

### 4. Objective

The objective of the NTI President for a Day Contest is to select a high school student to write and deliver a speech during the launch of the monument commissioned to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement on Nunavut Day, July 9, 2013. Entries must relate to the topic of Nunavut and the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement. Entries must have entirely original content created only by eligible participants. Entries must be appropriate for broadcast or publishing.

### 5. Criteria

Submissions must relate to Nunavut and the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.

The speech must not be more than 500 words.

Speeches may be submitted in Inuktitut, Inuinnaqtun or English.

### 6. Entering the NTI President for a Day Contest

The completed submission, together with all the information and materials set out below, must be submitted on or before 5 p.m. ET on April 26, 2013 to the address set out in Section 1 of the NTI President for a Day Contest Rules and Regulations. Contestants can send their submissions via Canada Post or email. If the submission is sent via Canada Post, the submission must be post-marked on or before April 26, 2013. No entry fee is required.



## NTI President for a Day Contest

The entry package must include:

- a) One copy of the speech.
- b) Completed release and consent form.
- c) If the submission is sent via Canada Post, the following additional information should be printed on the submission envelope: The NTI President for a Day Contest.

### 7. Selection of winning entries

One high school student will be selected as the winner for the NTI President for a Day Contest. The submissions will be evaluated by a panel of NTI judges. The evaluation will be based on the following criteria:

- a) Understanding of Nunavut and the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement.
- b) Creativity and originality.
- c) Overall effectiveness in presentation.

### 8. Notification and verification

The winner of the NTI President for a Day Contest will be contacted in May, 2013. The winner will travel to Iqaluit with an adult chaperone to deliver their speech during the unveiling of the monument commissioned to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement. The winner will co-host the Nunavut Day activities with the NTI president, and will perform other NTI presidential duties as required.

The winning entry will also be posted on NTI's website, [www.tunngavik.com](http://www.tunngavik.com). Press releases and media attention may occur as a result of winning the NTI President for a Day Contest. By entering the contest, each participant consents to the use of her or his entry and name for any publicity purposes.

### 9. Prizes

The winner will be awarded two return airline tickets from the winner's home community or place of residence (in Canada) to Iqaluit. These tickets will be used to fly the winner and an adult chaperone to Iqaluit to deliver the speech on Nunavut Day, July 9, 2013. Meals and accommodations will also be paid for by NTI. If the winner already resides in Iqaluit, a cash prize of \$1,500 will be awarded.

### 10. Acceptance of the NTI President for a Day Contest Rules and Regulations

By entering the NTI President for a Day Contest, each participant agrees to accept all decisions of the judges. All decisions are final and binding. By entering the NTI President for a Day Contest, each participant releases NTI and any other person or entity associated in any way with the NTI President for a Day Contest from any and all liability arising in connection with the contest, including, without limitation, the selection of the winning entries and the use of the prizes.
