

NUNAVUT TUNNGAVIK FOUNDATION CULTURAL AND HEALING PROGRAM

Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. is pleased to announce the launch of the Cultural and Healing Program, a contribution program aimed at providing funds for cultural and healing projects to Inuit enrolled under the Nunavut Agreement.

The Program is funded through Tunngavik Foundation that received the remainder of the Common Experience Payment Trust Fund and is administered by Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated's Division of Inuit Programs and Services.

Eligible Programs and Amounts

Up to ten applicants will be selected to receive a maximum of up to \$25,000 dollars, for any project that provides any of the following, to at least 75% Nunavut Inuit clientele;

- Healing programs that address the harms and intergenerational effects of Residential Schools;
- Teaching of Inuit history, culture, languages and traditions; or
- Traditional or on-the-land programs.

Eligible Applicants

The following individuals, groups and organizations may apply for funding from the Program:

- Inuit enrolled under the Nunavut Agreement;
- Educational institutions (Elementary/Secondary Schools and Post-Secondary Institutions)
- Registered Not-for-profit corporations or societies (including early childhood centres or friendship/urban centres); and
- Unregistered groups of which the majority of its members or clientele are Nunavut Inuit.

Application Documents and Timelines

When submitting an application, please ensure to include the following;

- The name, address and contact information of the individual, group or organization;
- Detailed proposal of the cultural or healing project to be delivered;
- Expected percentage of targeted Nunavut Inuit; and
- Projected costs and expenses;

The application period will be open from May 1 to May 31, 2019 to allow for applicants to develop and deliver spring and summer programs if they so wish. The Selection Committee will review proposals reasonably thereafter the deadline closes and the Program Officer may request for further information from any applicant where warranted.

Funding Agreements

A successful applicant will be required to enter into a funding agreement with the Foundation that outlines payment installments, the recipient's obligations to provide financial and activity reports after a project is completed and any other term or condition pertaining to the delivery of the project.
